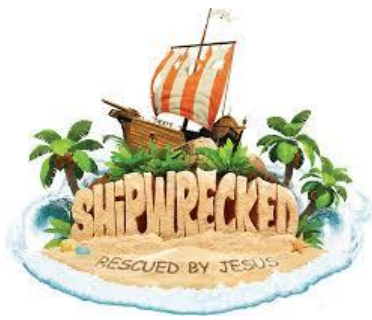

Notes From The Garden, May, 2018

Well the 2018 garden season is well underway. In February, the Sunday School students started plants from seeds. We have tomatoes, peppers and herbs growing well on my front porch/greenhouse. In a couple of weeks we will be transplanting them into the garden.

On April 29, the Sunday School students helped plant radishes, beets, carrots, spinach and two varieties of leaf lettuce. The students did a great job and I appreciate their help. Many hands made light work of that project.

We were able to purchase a garden cart/wagon with contributions. It was a God thing. On a Sunday morning in March some contributions were given to the garden. When we got home from Church I was reading the Menards ad and guess what. The garden cart was on sale! We went down that afternoon and purchased it. This will make hauling the produce to the parking lot for distribution much easier. Thank you to those who gave.

We have also received donations of seeds and plants. Thank you to Kay Hammer for the start of chives for the herb garden. We also have oregano, sage and parsley.

On May 5, Tom Wilkey and his brother Phil moved the wood shed from the parsonage property over to the garden. This shed will be used for storage for tools, tomato cages and the various things we use when we have distribution on Saturdays. One of the most important uses for the shed is to harvest rain water into the two 300 gallon tanks Chuck got free from a recycling center. This will more than triple the amount of water available to the garden! It will also be much closer and more convenient to use. So a big THANK YOU to the Wilkey brothers and Chuck Huling for making garden life much easier.

I have had some people asking if we are going to have the garden again this year. The answer is a big YES, so please get the word out. Tell your friends and neighbors.

We will be giving produce to the monthly distribution at the food pantry again this year. We will also be open Saturday mornings for distribution.

We will be looking for volunteers to help with the distribution on Saturday mornings. Distribution will be from 10:00am to noon. It is pretty simple. You just give away all the produce we have picked. If you like talking to people and making them feel at home, this might be something you would be good at.
