


## Pastor's Message

In twenty-eight years of ordained ministry I have had the privilege of being with many people and families at life's end (that is, this side of heaven's doors). I sometimes forget that, what has become a natural part of living and dying to me, is still something very unknown and uncomfortable to others. I was reminded of this recently when I sat down with a few family members to put onto paper some of their information and wishes – at this point in their lives – for when that time comes. [My thanks again to Duffy-Pils Memorial Home for providing me with the resources to do this, for a Lenten Lunch service earlier this year, with some to spare.] Completing/sharing such information is a form of gift planning in and of itself as far as I am concerned; a gift to the individual to know their wishes are known, and a gift to family that already have far too many things on their hearts and minds at the time of death.

We gave thought to types of burial and where that might be: visitation and funeral, cremation, human composting (now legal in Washington state), and even having one's remains placed in the soil supplements for a tree to be planted. We talked about organ donation and embalming. We talked about what were services important enough to us that we would designate them for memorials. We thought about the expenses we would consider appropriate for such an occasion. While the pastor of a congregation is always the one who should preside at the funeral of members of a congregation, a pastor's family is a family without a pastor, and so we talked about who we would ask to preside at our funeral / memorial. We let lyrics play through our minds as we thought about what music would best celebrate and proclaim. Each of the four of us that gave thought to this came up with wishes unique to us, some we would not have known were it not for being intentional.

Most of us are too busy living this life to want to think about it ending. In all this talk we followers of Christ are confident that this life is not it, but a foretaste of the feast to come. Yet, it is through death that each of us goes home. So I ask you, are your wishes known to you, let alone to those who might have the responsibility of taking care of things when you die? If you have made such arrangements – thank you for the gift you have given. If you have not made such arrangements, I would be glad to help you, whether that be just providing you an information form to complete, or talking to you about it individually or with family.
